# **Students' Feedback Analysis of Berhampore College**


### **Summary**

Feedback was collected from 1038 students of Berhampore College during the year 2021-22 as a part of the College Level Student Satisfactory Survey (SSS). To conduct this SSS Feedback forms were circulated among the students of Berhampore College through their mailID.

### **Feedback Analysis**

The first question that was posed in the survey was regarding the percentage of syllabus that was covered by the teachers during class. The response of some of the students was positive as 239 students (23% of




the total) answering that between 85-100% percent of the syllabus was covered in class. 321 students

(30.1% of the total) students confirmed that 70-84% of the syllabus had been covered in class. The overall response was, however, mixed as the rest of the students posited that less than 69% of the syllabus was completed in class.

The second question in the feedback survey assessed the preparedness of the teachers who were conducting their respective classes. The response here was overwhelmingly positive with majority of the students confirming that the teachers were thoroughly and satisfactorily prepared with their lesson plans.

The third questioned dealt with the teacher's ability to communicate effectively with the students in order to comprehensively deliver the educational content within the classroom. The bulk of students who responded to the survey (54.5%), believed that the teachers practiced effective means of communicating. Question 4 enquired about the overall quality of teaching and the response was largely good with very few students stating otherwise.

For the fifth criteria, the students were questioned regarding the fairness of internal evaluation. The response here was also mixed, while half of the responders said that the evaluation process of internal examination was fair and just there was a small percentage that said that inherent biases of certain teachers effected the overall marking of the students.




Students also stated that the results of their internal examinations were often discussed with them however, a very small percentage of students wish that the discussion was made more often and in greater details.

Majority of the students also believe that the college actively promotes student exchange, field visits and internships. Furthermore, a significant portion of the students who responded to the survey believe that the college plays an active part in facilitating their social, cognitive and emotional growth, providing them with ample opportunities to learn and grow. The students further believe that the teachers keep them well informed about their own proficiencies, course expectations and the ultimate course outcomes. The students also by and large agree that the teacher follow up with them regarding the assigned tasks.

Teaching is learner centric with the teachers providing the students with apposite examples and instances from other fields in order to clearly demonstrate the point of the lessons. A majority of students feel that their strengths and weaknesses are adequately highlighted by the exercises and challenges presented to them during class. The student weaknesses that do get highlighted are, according to most of the surveyed students, dealt with in a mature and organized manner with the ultimate intention of helping the students overcome their initial shortcomings. More than 73% of the students surveyed agree that the institution makes the requisite effort to engage them in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching-learning process. The teachers moreover make the required effort to encourage the students to participate in extracurricular activities for a more holistic development of the learner. The students largely agree that the quality of teaching with the institution is excellent and greatly benefit the students.

The students' response to question 19 requires a slightly more detailed deliberation. When asked whether the teachers employ the vast range of ICT tools that are made available to them by the excellent



infrastructural facilities of the college, the response was mixed and far from encouraging. It appears that in terms of embracing the new pedagogical tools, the students believe that there is definitely scope for future improvements.

### **Actions taken**

All the grievances that were received the students' satisfaction survey were placed to Grievance Redressal Cell. To resolve the grievances, a meeting of that cell was organized on 30.11.2022 and resolution of the meeting was submitted to the IQAC. After receiving the resolution, the IQAC recommended the following suggestions to the Principal of the HEI which he took under consideration and implemented therequisite steps. The suggestions and actions are summarized in table 1:



Apart from that, IQAC has continued the conversation with some institution in this field to sign memorandum of understanding with them for collaborative venture.
5.
